




## *Kelsey & Josh Dansby*

The bride walked down the isle to "She's Everything" by Tim McGraw. The couple had a sand-in-the-bottle unity ceremony where the bride & groom filled beach sand into a keepsake heart-shaped bottle. 
The couple hosted an intimate reception, with a small gathering of family held at Barefoot Beach Club in Panama City Beach. A larger reception with family and all their friends was held in their hometown of Hartsville, TN at the Green Hills

The reception immediately following the wedding at the Barefoot Beach Club was a sit down luncheon. The menu consisted of fresh local seafood ordered right off the menu. The reception held in the Green Hills Country Club in Tennessee was decorated with a “coastal seaside” theme. The tables were covered with white linens. Each centerpiece consisted of a tulip-style glass vase filled with water and white sand—brought by the bridal couple from Panama City Beach—and a variety of shells with floating candles. Casablanca Lily arrangements were placed throughout to give the room a fresh tropical feel. Fare provided at the reception consisted of assorted hors d’oeuvres; wings with assorted sauces, meatballs in a tangy Italian sauce, assorted deli meats with croissants, a selection of cheeses and crudités. The main dish was chilled emerald coast shrimp served with spicy cocktail sauce and tossed salad.

At the Barefoot Beach Club reception, the cake was provided by Cakes By Tanis of Panama City, Florida. It’s her signature Seashell Wedding Cake which is a big hit with many beach brides. The Seashell design consisted of 3 tiers of white vanilla wedding cake made with fondant icing , accented with real seashells and edible coral reef made from white chocolate. Around the base of the wedding cake, sugar was sprinkled to look like real beach sand!
